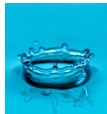

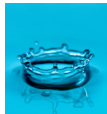

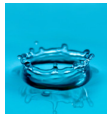

What are these Long-term Classes?

There is a WWATER long-term class coming soon to your area. These classes meet one afternoon a week for approximately 16 –18 weeks. The class will be held in a facility/classroom in your area. During the class sessions, you will receive handouts, and will attend the class with the other students in your class. You will also have “take-home” tests, which will either be actual paper tests or will be online. You have a second chance to take the tests, after getting the opportunity to go over class materials in class.

One of the most important aspects of the class are what is known as the **PIT Stops**. PIT Stops, or *Personalized Instruction and Training*, is where the student and the

instructor get to meet one-on-one at the student’s facility, or somewhere else that is pertinent to the class. Just as the name implies, these PIT Stops give the student the opportunity for personalized instruction and training. PIT Stops—usually 1/2 to one day in length—give the student the opportunity to learn more about their system, and gives them a chance to “go above and beyond”. They are “where the rubber meets the road”, and give the students the chance to put to use what they have been learning in class; or to get help with other things

Some examples of recent PIT Stops are:

- Performing Lab tests
- Customized Training/tutoring

- Getting help with class material, tests, etc.
- Consulting help
- Facility Familiarization
- Math
- Pumping Rates/Lift Station Drawdown
- ...and much more.

PIT Stops, although not required, allow the student to work with the instructor in a one-to-one format. This frees up the student to ask questions and get personalized help in a private format. The PIT Stops are coordinated between the student and the instructor, allowing

customized, personalized training/informational sessions. This is similar to the “shop” portion of traditional technical education, but with a personalized/customized component not achievable in traditional settings.

During one PIT Stop, it was discovered that a new lift station was not needed, as had been thought; thereby saving the community over \$40,000.

In another PIT Stop, more than \$80,000 was saved because the operator learned that a new

wastewater pond cell did not have to be installed, as was previously thought.

And, in one PIT Stop, more than 2 million dollars was saved! The operator and the city was told that they would need a new Activated Sludge plant because the flow was too high for the existing system. However, the flow numbers were based on inaccurate and incorrect information, and the facility would have been built much larger than needed. This would have also made the treatment facility much more difficult to operate, thereby wasting even more money.

There is no charge for the PIT Stops—they are included in the price of the course. Just the PIT Stops alone may be more than worth the price of the course many times over! Contact WWATER if you have questions.
