<b>Workshop Name</b>	Wastewater Small Systems
<b>Summary</b>	The workshop covers different types of wastewater ponds, as well as topics such as preliminary treatment, wastewater characteristics, environmental effects on wastewater, and some math. Some other similar WWWATER classes: Wastewater Stabilization Ponds, Wastewater District school.  NOTE: This is a one-day workshop, so only gives 5 hours of KDHE credit.

<b>Target Audience</b>	Small systems operators, and those just starting out in the wastewater field.

### Workshop Description

The Small Wastewater Systems workshop is designed to give the operator a better understanding of their small wastewater system. Some of the topics covered in the workshop include: Wastewater Characteristics, Collection Systems and lift stations, Safety, Wastewater Lagoons, and Math.

The workshop is designed to give an overview of the things an operator of a small wastewater system should know to perform their job. Successful completion of the Small Systems workshop will help the operator prepare for the Small Systems Examination given by KDHE.



Bring a pencil and/or pen and a calculator; we will be solving typical wastewater math problems.

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**NOTE:** Small Systems Certification requirements are not the same as Class I-IV Certification requirements. This class will meet these less-stringent requirements for Small Systems certification. This one-day class will give the Small Systems operator the required hours needed for certificate renewal, but if a Class I-IV operator takes this class, they will still need to gain more hours/points to meet the stricter requirements of their certification.
